THIS SCHOOL YEAR BRINGS SOME EXCITING CHANGES

★ In June, the Timothy Murphy School for Boys sadly closed their doors. AFTH has been working at TMS since 2008 and we are extremely disappointed that we will no longer be working with these students.

★ We are excited to bring AFTH to the Irene H. Hunt School at Side by Side in San Anselmo. We now work with 60 boys and girls ranging in age from 7 to 17, as well as several of our students from Timothy Murphy who are now in this program. Side by Side offers young people impacted by adversity a positive, supportive, safe, educational environment to help them heal from trauma, restore resilience and embrace their own potential.

★ AFTH added five new classes at the San Pedro Elementary School.
